

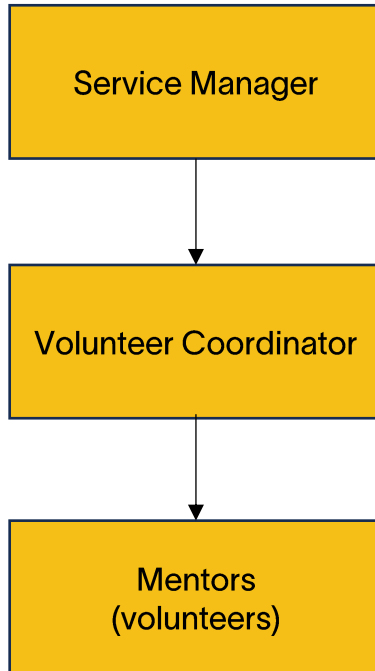

Job Purpose

Volunteer Mentor



Our young persons mentoring programme encourages personal growth, social connection and sustainable integration within communities for the people we support across the Greater Glasgow, South Lanarkshire and Edinburgh areas.

Through one-to-one support the volunteer mentor will help young people aged 18 or under that are currently being supported by our Short Term Housing, Supported Accommodation and Outreach programmes to develop skills that will enable them to thrive.

About Right There



We are Right There, a charity having just celebrated our 200th anniversary in 2024. We provide tailored support for people, at home, and in the community. We are here for people who are living with the effects of homelessness, poverty, addiction, or family breakdowns. Last year we supported almost 4,000 individuals, helping to prevent them from becoming homeless or separated from the people they love.

We are here to offer the right support at the right time, including breaking down financial barriers; accessing the private rental market; linking up with local health, employment and training services to help people make connections within the community; and helping people feel happier, safer, and more confident to take steps to improve their own lives.

Every person's story is unique, and everyone's route home is different, so we tailor our response to the individual. We want to challenge stereotypes – it doesn't matter what the situation is – we're not here to judge, only to help.

Our approach is about creating trusting relationships and nurturing people's strengths, and our 200 dedicated staff, mentors and volunteers play a crucial role in this.

For People

We provide tailored support for children and adults to help individuals and families feel happier, create stronger bonds and stay together.



At Home

We provide safe and supportive places to call home for people of all ages, from any circumstances, for as long as they might need it.



In The Community

We provide the tools for people to live independently and build their lives within their community, creating their own safe and secure homes.

Our Vision

A world where everyone has an equal chance to create a safe and supportive place to call home.

Our Mission

We meet people where they are in life with no judgement; walking alongside those who need support, and preventing them becoming homeless or separated from the people they love.

Role Responsibilities

Relationships

- Develop good communication and working relationships with mentees, other mentors and Right There team members.
- Support mentees in the local community.
- Represent Right There to relevant bodies as/when required.

Practice & Service Delivery

- Provide appropriate levels of high-quality support to mentees.
- Accurately record matters relating to mentees and report as appropriate.
- Signpost and refer to other agencies as appropriate.
- Ensure you adopt a person-centered approach and participate in reflective practice.
- Ensure awareness of service model.
- Actively participate in regular support and supervision as well as group meetings to share experiences, exchange and increase knowledge and keep in touch with other mentors and staff.

Personal & Organisational Development

- Actively contribute to your service through the mentor advisory group.
- Attend and participate in training and share learning experiences.
- Engage in reflective practice.
- Feedback on the review of organisational policies & procedures and local guidelines.
- Promote and represent Right There services positively.
- Strive for continuous personal and professional development.
- Volunteer mentors report to the Volunteer Coordinator
- Volunteer mentors commit to approximately 2 hours per week for minimum of 12 months by mutual agreement between themselves and the mentee.

We're looking for someone who thrives in face-to-face interactions and is confident meeting mentees in community settings. The ideal candidate will:

- ✓ Be kind, empathetic, approachable, and able to build trust with individuals from diverse backgrounds.
- ✓ Communicate clearly and respectfully, adapting to different environments and situations.
- ✓ Be reliable and consistent, with a strong sense of responsibility toward their mentee.
- ✓ Maintain confidentiality and professional boundaries at all times.
- ✓ Be culturally aware and open-minded, with a genuine interest in supporting others.
- ✓ Have a positive, encouraging attitude and a willingness to learn.
- ✓ Be comfortable travelling within the community to meet mentees where they are.
- ✓ Be available to dedicate up to 2 hours per week or fortnight supporting your mentee

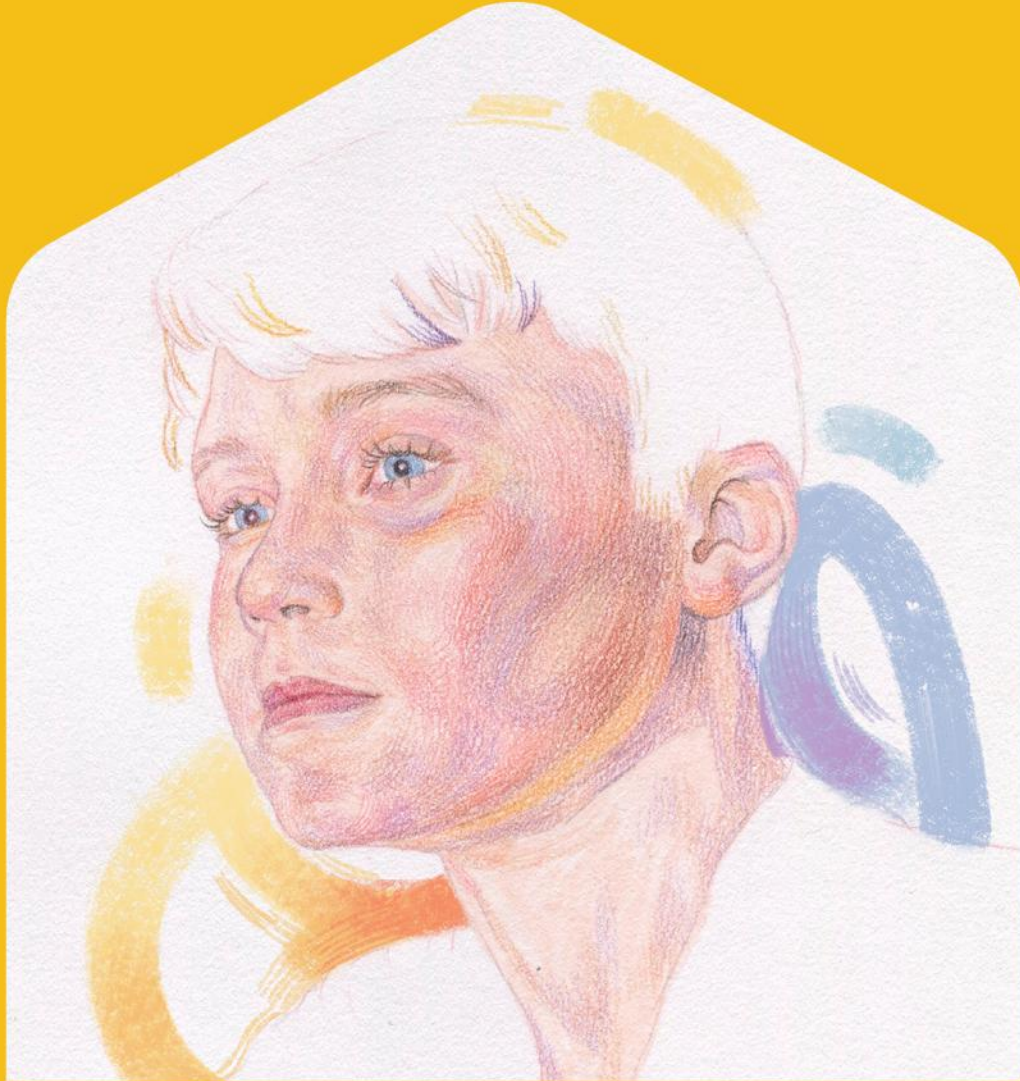
- Up to 2 hours per week or fortnight
